AHUG/PA Woodmobile Day

All third grade students in Warren County are invited to spend a day learning about forest products, wildlife management, oil and gas exploration and careers associated with the abundant natural resources around us.

Elementary School Rally Day

This new event targeted at fifth graders, brings career information into the schools. High energy presentations by career exemplars link classroom activity and career standards.

Middle School Career Day

This event allows middle school students to explore lifestyles and career opportunities. By identifying aptitudes and interests, they can begin to plan their secondary and post-secondary education to support their goals for career and life.

Industry Club of Warren County

Middle school students explore the world of work, learning about career clusters during this after school program. They visit employers, interact with speakers, create projects based on their interests, travel to college campuses, and compete in a regional event at the end of the program.

Girls ONLY Camp

In this day camp girls in grades 7 and 8 explore non-traditional careers emphasizing Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. Field trips, speakers, and activities add to a week of fun.

Space Camp

Three days of training lead up to an exciting visit to the Challenger Learning Center of the Twin Tier Region to "fly" a mission. Students de-brief on the last day of this week-long day camp, and hold a press conference for families and the media.

Fast Track College Fair

Juniors and seniors from all Warren County schools attend this day-long event featuring over 40 colleges, universities, and technical schools, as well as military recruiters.

Fast Track Financial Aid Night

Families of students planning for post-secondary education attend this event. Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency representatives conduct a workshop on securing financial aid for college.

FAFSA Workshop

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is required for students planning to pursue their education beyond high school. At this workshop, families will have the opportunity to complete the application, improving the chances they will receive financial support for higher education from schools and government sources.

Job Shadow Program

Students visit workplaces that match their career interests and spend time with a mentor. This experience can help them decide whether or not to pursue a particular career. May be used as part of a student's graduation portfolio.

Career Exploration Days

Groups of students visit popular business and industry locations for an overview of the operations and focus on areas of interest.

Educator in the Workplace

This summer program allows teachers to spend time in the workplaces of various business partners. They bring knowledge of current business practices and educational requirements back to the classroom.
