Financial Aid Representatives from the University of Pittsburgh-Bradford will help you complete the FAFSA.

The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student aid) is the first step in the financial aid process. It is used to apply for federal student aid, such as grants, loans and work-study. In Pennsylvania, information from the FAFSA is used to award other types of aid as well, including the Pennsylvania State Grant. (PHEAA)

Advance registration is required

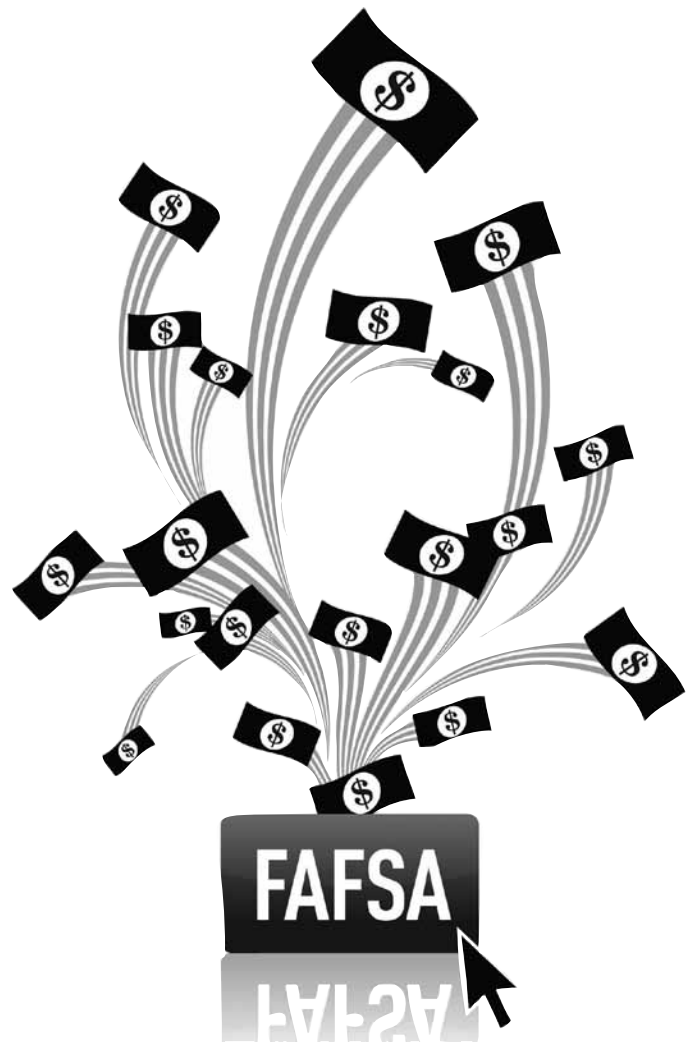

Make sure you bring your information with you to complete the FAFSA

- Your Social Security Number
- Your driver's license number, if you have one
- Your 2011 W-2 Forms
- Your 2011 federal income tax return
- Your current bank statements and records of stocks, bonds and other investments
- Your records of other 2011 untaxed income received, such as Social Security, Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), welfare or veterans benefits
- Your business or farm records, if applicable
- Your alien registration number, if you are not a U.S. citizen

If you are a dependent student, you will also need:

- Your parent's Social Security Number(s)
- Your parent's 2011 income and financial records (as listed above)



Get a PIN at pin.ed.gov It allows you to:

- Sign your FAFSA on the Web electronically (If you are a dependent student, both you and one of your parents must electronically sign the FAFSA.)
- Review and correct answers on your electronic Student Aid Report (SAR) and print a copy
- Electronically sign loan promissory notes
- Reapply for student aid every year you are in school

Your parent(s) can also request and use their own PINs to sign your FAFSA online. We encourage you to apply for a PIN Prior to submitting your FAFSA, but if you don't, a PIN will be automatically sent to you once the application has been processed.

You can access the FAFSA electronically at PHEAA.org/FAFSA or fafsa.ed.gov Electronic filing is the fastest and easiest way to apply for financial aid. It's also more accurate because the information you enter in FAFSA on the Web will be edited and you will be notified of any errors or missing information. This reduces the chance your application might be rejected or that you will need to correct your information later.
